Great article on pot selection

The link above takes you to Harry Harrington's web page on bonsai. If you are unfamiliar with Harry Harrington, he is a bonsai artist in the United Kingdom, the author of several books, and articles on his web page. He specializes in working with poor quality material to make beautiful bonsai specimens.

The article covers pot dimensions, pot shape (masculine versus feminine), color, pot and tree color combinations, and pot texture. The article would not reproduce well here, so I urge you to make the extra effort to click on the link above. Here is a teaser:

"As can be seen in this article, choosing the correct pot is not simple but it can be learnt. Ultimately, a combination of personal tastes, knowledge and experience makes the process much easier.

When buying pots for your bonsai try to make sure you know the pot measurements needed for a tree. It is no good buying a suitable pot only to find it is too big or small for your tree.

Have a good idea of the shape that will suit the masculinity or femininity of your tree.

Have a good idea of the colours and textures that will suit your tree.

Don't be embarrassed to ask the advice of the bonsai nursery or the potter you are buying from, an experienced potter or bonsai nursery will always be able to give you a choice of suitable pots to choose from. However, always try to have a picture of your tree to hand as this makes the nursery or potter's job much, much easier!"

BONSAI GLOSSARY

SEASONAL Bonsai - a species that look their best for only a short time when in flower or fruit.

SENESCENT - older; growing old.

SOIL - for growing Bonsai. a specialized soil is required which contains various mixtures of organic soil made from plants, peat, bark or leaf litter and, of inorganic soil containing stone, mineral or fired clay such as grit, sand, Akadama or turface. Read about Bonsai soil.

SPECIES - the sub-division of a Genus; the second name in the Latin terminology (Acer palmatum).

SPHAGNUM MOSS - general name given to a long fibred moss used as an organic soil component for Bonsai and air-layering; has a great ability to absorb and hold moisture. STYLE - the way in which a Bonsai has been shaped in order to compliment the form (direction) of the trunk.

SUBSTRATE - the material on which a plant grows. Read more about <u>Bonsai soil</u>. TERMINAL - apical; outermost tip.

TERMINAL BUD - a bud formed at the tip of a stem, twig or branchlet.

TREE - Bonsai growers will commonly refer to their Bonsai as trees rather than as bonsai.

TRUNK LEADER - uppermost branch on a previously cut off trunk that is trained to grow vertically as an extension of that trunk.

UNDER-WATERING - when a tree is allowed to dry out completely or, is not watered thoroughly when required.

VARIETY - the sub-division of species; the third name in Latin terminology (Acer palmatum "Deshojo"). Synonymous with "cultivar".

WIRING - a technique using wire to bend a branch or trunk in a certain direction thus training it to grow in that way. Read more about <u>Wiring</u>.

XYLEM - area below the cambium layer in a trunk.

Please follow these guidelines:

Multiple submissions are acceptable. We encourage <u>all</u> members to submit a tree especially the beginners, members with less than five (5) years experience. We will have a table specifically for beginners, so please submit your tree.

You are responsible for delivering your tree to the exhibit area, placing it where directed, and picking it up at the designated time Sunday afternoon. Times will be clarified as we approach the exhibit date.

We expect your tree to be delivered following this criteria:

Pot is clean and weed free with ground cover, i.e. moss. We suggest you start now during the rainy season to collect moss, place it around your tree and allow it to grow into the pot.

No noticeable wire. It is distracting and detracts from your tree.

Place your tree on either a table or jita slab.

A stand/jita and accent plant to accompany the tree to tell the story of your tree.

A scroll is optional. Some tables in the center of the exhibit room do not have a wall and unable to hang a scroll. Final location of your tree is at the discretion of the exhibit group.

If you choose, you may water your plant or spray it as you choose. We will not be watering plants.

You are asked to make up to submit a maximum of 3 choices, if you choose. We may only need one, but it is advantageous to be able to call on people if we fall short.

Finally, If you do not want your tree judged, please check "no" where applicable on the form. Any tree can be critiqued for possible improvements while not being judged. A tree that has not been judged is not eligible for an award but is eligible for the <u>People Choice</u> Award.

CATEGORY DEFINITIONS:

HEALTH There is good color and vibrant appearance.
NEBARI Is the Nebari evenly divided and well-spaced.
DEPTH Tree appears 3- dimensional on all sides.
TAPER The trunk and branches have proper taper.
MOVEMENT There is good flow in trunk and branches.
CREATIVITY Artists' concept is very visible in the creation.
POT SELECTION Pot size, shape and color match composition.
MATURITY Are old wounds healed, tool marks removed and does the design feel complete and aged.
RAMIFICATION The number of branch divisions and where they are grown.
