
# **Buttonwood**

<u>History:</u> The buttonwood is native to South Florida, the Bahamas, West Indies, Central and South America, and Mexico. <u>This plant is a must for the Florida bonsai artist</u>. A native to Florida's southern coastlines throughout the zone 10 range, it grows as far north as Cape Kennedy along the Indian River. It grows to heights of 50' or more. The wood was once used to make buttons. The best buttonwoods for Bonsai, because of the large amount of deadwood, are found in the Florida Keys. Even some of the smallest specimens have beautiful <u>Shari</u> or deadwood. Most of this is protected and permission is needed to collect. Buttonwood is sometimes included as a member of the mangrove family. It is not a true mangrove, however, as it cannot tolerate its roots in salt water. It is usually easy to distinguish the buttonwood from other mangroves as it grows slightly inland while the mangroves have their feet in the water. <u>Read more.</u> Also, see this link to <u>Wigert's</u> about Buttonwood.
